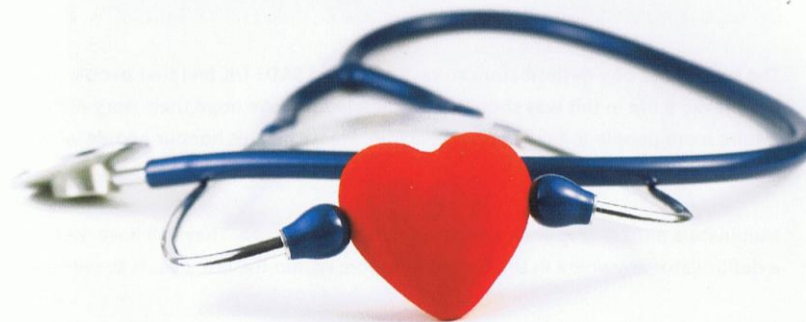

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The national cardiac charity SADS UK believe that as cardiac arrest can affect anyone, even children, that AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) should be available in as many places as possible.

The speedy use of a defibrillator can save a life and SADS UK feel that people who have saved a life in this way should be acknowledged. We hope their story will inspire more people to take lifesaving action. Please help us honour people who have saved a life.

Nominate a person who you feel should receive this award. They will have used a defibrillator anywhere in the United Kingdom within the last 2 years to save a life.

Your testimonial is vital. Testimonials that are picked by the judges will be shared at an awards Dinner which will be held in October. Deadline for the submission of testimonials is the 31st July.



Write to SADS UK with a 300 to 750 word testimony explaining why you feel that the person you have nominated should receive an award. The person you are nominating may be a member of the public or they may have acted/responded outside the normal remit of their everyday work.

Did they co-ordinate other people to assist in helping the person who had suffered cardiac arrest? What did they do?

Did they have prior training in CPR and/or using the defibrillator?

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
